


3 out of 5 (200 Mn)

Out of the 10 countries that drink the most in the world (and adjusting for tourist consumption), nine are located in the European Union (EU).

of spirits).











Alcohol (Carcinogen) Export: European Union (EU)



• EU wine sector is the EU's biggest agriculture exporter



• €17.2 Bn Alcohol export in 2021.

The EU Wine industry contributed a surplus of €15.4 Bn to the EU trade balance



From 2008 and 2018, the total exports of EU wine to third countries have grown from 17.3 Mio hl to 22.6 Mio hl (+31% in volume), and from €6.2 billion to €11.6 Billion (+87% in value)



Alcohol is carcinogenic



Promoting awareness about alcohol and cancer risks



European Commission (EC) may reflect on ...!

Alcohol is a toxic, psychoactive and dependence producing substance and has been classified as Group 1 carcinogen by the WHO 30 years ago.

According to WHO, the European Region has the highest alcohol consumption level and over 200 million people are at the risk of alcohol attributable cancer.

The European
Commission (EC)
attempts to project
itself as a global
regulator in the
field of health and
environment.

In the opinion of the EC, even 0.01 ppm level of certain agrochemical residues in the food could be carcinogenic/harmf ul. But in case of alcohol, no such worries!



Strange logic. EC maintains a "spirited silence" in case of alcohol use. Perhaps commercial interests weigh heavily.

Final Word

If the EU/EC seeks to contain the cancers, the priority regulatory focus must be on alcohol – the Group 1 human carcinogen.
